



Signing of a partnership agreement between the École Des Arts Décoratifs — PSL and the Hong-Kong Polytechnic University

Monday, June 30th the School of Decorative Arts - PSL had the pleasure of welcoming a delegation from the School of Design of Hong-Kong Polytechnic University (PolyU), in order to sign a memorandum of understanding.





Professor KP Lee, Dean of PolyU Design, and Professor Henry Duh, Associate Dean, were received by Emmanuel Tibloux, Director of the École des Arts Décoratifs – PSL, along with the teams in charge of international relations and research. The signing of the agreement was followed by a tour of the school, allowing the delegation to discover the many technical workshops that contribute to ENSAD's reputation.

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This two-year agreement aims to foster strategic collaboration between the two institutions, both in the field of academic exchanges as well as of research.

It reflects the commitment of both schools to strengthen cooperation between their countries, increase opportunities for student, faculty, and administrative mobility, and above all, to establish close collaboration in research through the implementation of joint projects.

This memorandum of understanding has helped identify key areas of cooperation, and the teams from both institutions will work in the coming months to define more precisely the format of this partnership.

This agreement reflects a shared commitment to invest in common areas of interest: user-centered design, forward-looking approaches to practices, responsible innovation, and the local integration of environmental design.

The École des Arts Décoratifs – PSL is developing this partnership in the frame of its active internationalization strategy, particularly in Asia, where it has been developing long-term academic ties, as evidenced by the double degree program established with Bunka Gakuen University (Tokyo) in 2016.

With PolyU Design, ranked among the world's top design schools according to the QS World University Ranking, it is the start of a new synergy emerging between two complementary institutions. Located at the heart of a dynamic urban, economic, and technological ecosystem, the PolyU School of Design is renowned for its expertise in strategic design, social innovation, urban design, UX/UI, mobility, and branding.

For its part, the École des Arts Décoratifs – PSL asserts a vision of design that is deeply rooted in the challenges of ecological and social transition. Through its programs in Product Design, Graphic Design, and Textile and Texture Design, as well as its research lab in art and creative practices EnsadLab, the school promotes an engaged approach to eco-design, low-impact in creative processes, and a design practice oriented toward the common good.

This partnership represents a remarkable opportunity for students and faculty alike to exchange perspectives and methods, develop hybrid and context-sensitive practices, and explore their creative imaginaries through a dynamic dialogue between Europe and Asia.

The École des Arts Décoratifs – PSL is delighted with the signing of this agreement, an exciting first milestone in a partnership that is intended to grow and deepen over the years.


